They have released songs in collaboration with sake breweries from all over Japan to promote their products.






Music for SDOS


Meghan Picerno (soprano/opera singer/musical actress)

Argentina world bachata champions encouraging people and bringing happiness through dancing


Marcero & Belen (Bachata dancers)

That same year, they became **South American champions of Bachata Stars Competition**, which brought them to compete in the world final in Spain, getting the 4th place.

In 2016, they won the 2nd place in World Bachata Open, in Albacete, Spain. They competed in World Latin Dance Cup in Miami and won the 2nd place in Bachata Dominicana Cabaret and the 3rd place in Bachata Sensual Cabaret.

In February of 2017, they became champions, winning the 1st place in World Bachata Masters, the most important competition of all. In 2017 they also became champions of World Bachata Open and World Bachata Fusion competition.

In 2018, they won the 2nd place, and in 2019, they won the 1st place again in World Bachata Masters.
